1. Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance: Chair Torgerson called the meeting to order, and the Pledge of Allegiance was said. She noted that the meeting was properly posted.
2. Roll Call: Also present was Supervisors Palubicki, Maes and Clerk/Treasurer Frank. Others totaled 5.
3. Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes; Review and approve minutes from January 13, 2026, meeting.
4. Treasurer's Report for January and February 2026, outstanding claims: Motion by Palubicki to approve to ck #6800 February) and to ck# 6816(March) and February and March Auto withdrawals and online payments. All in favor, motion carried.
5. Public Comment
 - a. Noel VanDiver-Transportation: Noel VanDiver and Dillon Wagnitz appeared to inform the Town Board about the new Transportation Safety Plan approved by the Sokaogon Chippewa Community. Noel informed the board of the funding available to the tribe for their transportation budget and discussed ways the Town and Tribe can work together. The tribe will be purchasing road work equipment and will be able to assist the Town in area of roads. Dillon will be working with our road crew for training purposes.

6. Reports from Officials: Bead Grant, Lily District Cost Sharing Agreement:

Bead Grant: Torgerson Discussed the Bead Grant that was recently awarded to the tribe she attended the award ceremony last week. This award will greatly impact the surrounding areas for access to the internet.

LLD Sharing agreement: Torgerson informed the Board that we will need to work with the Lily Lake District to update the Cost Sharing Agreement to reflect the changes that have taken place.
7. Action Items
 - a) Wake Boat Ordinance: Motion by Maes to rescind Ordinance No. 2025-03 (An ordinance Prohibiting wake-enhancing Watercraft Activities on All Waters Within the Town), Second by Palubicki. All in favor, motion carried.

 - d) Truck bid opening: Bids were submitted by the following Companies: Packer City Int'l Trks, U.P. Truck Center, Inc., Quinlan's Equipment, Kriete Truck Centers, and Truck Country. A Motion was made by Maes as follows, "Bids will be reviewed, and an award will be made at a later date." The motion was seconded by Palubicki, all in favor, motion carried.

e) Application to FCPC for Grant: Motion by Maes, second by Palubicki to apply to the FCPC grant opportunity for the purpose of helping with the Lily Lake Dam replacement project. All in favor, motion carried.

f) Application to Forest County Tourism for Grant: Motion by Palubicki, second by Maes to apply to the Forest County Tourism Committee grant opportunity for the purpose of helping with the Lily Lake Dam replacement project. Second by Maes, all in favor, motion carried.

g) Deputy Clerk/Treasurer: Motion by Palubicki to change the Clerk/Treasurer position from an elected position to an appointed position, with the option to create two positions (Clerk and Treasurer). Second by Maes. All in favor, motion carried.
